What gives you goose pimples?

Items every Goddess should try

1. Sheer fine deniers

Aristoc Ultra Shine Tights. For everyday office glamour you can't go wrong with these 10 denier, sheer to the waist, high shine, sandal-toed tights.

2. Sheer seamed stockings

Gio Fully Fashioned Seamed Stockings. These stockings from Gio have a high gloss finish and they're made on the original 1950's Reading machines and seams are hand sewn.

3. Black fine deniers

Woford Individual 10. These 10 denier matt appearance tights are a Woford bestseller. The lycra technology means these tights stretch in several directions to give a completely even coverage.

4. Fishnets

Jonathan Ashton Stringer Fishnets. Small holes in muted colours, like camel or charcoal, look great with knee-length skirts. Black is sexy but serious when the weave is small. White and red are hideous.

5. Black opaques

Woford Velvet De Luxe 50. White and coloured opaque tights can even make model's pins look stocky, so what hope is there for the rest of us? Choose these utterly thinnifying black ones instead.

6. Crochets

Trasparenze 60 Rimbaud tights www.calzetr trasparenze.com. Stick to dark colours like plum, olive, brown and black. Crochet, apart from insulating you against winter chills, looks very luxurious.

7. Floral Lace

Emilio Cavallini Floral Lace Tights. Along the same lines as crochet tights these have a lace finish with interwoven florals. Check www.fligleaves.com and www.emillocavallini.com, for more ideas.

8. Prints

Printed tights from www.lookfromlondon.com. Printed hose once you keep the scale small make a solid-coloured skirt or dress come alive. Also try Herringbone (tiny v-shapes), or 'bird's eye' (a tiny diamond design).
