 Rnd 6 (dc3, dc2 into next st) 3 times (15)

 Rnd 7 dc

 Rnd 8 (dc4, dc2 into next st) 3 times (18)

Rnd 9 dc Rnd 10 (dc5, dc2 into next st) 3 times (21) Rnd 11 dc Rnd 12 (dc6, dc2 into next st) 3 times (24) Rnd 13 dc Rnd 14 (dc7, dc2 into next st) 3 times (27) Stuff and backstitch into position on head

A:2

Ch12 and sl st to join into a circle **Rnds 1-20** dc (20 rnds) **Rnd 21** (dc5, dc2 into next st) twice (14) **Rnd 22** dc **Rnd 23** (dc6, dc2 into next st) twice (16) **Rnd 24** dc **Rnd 25** (dc7, dc2 into next st) twice (18) **Rnd 26** dc **Rnd 27** (dc8, dc2 into next st) twice (20) **Rnd 28** dc **Rnd 29** (dc9, dc2 into next st) twice (22) **Rnd 30** dc Rnd 31 (dc10, dc2 into next st) twice (24)
Rnd 32 dc
Rnd 33 (dc2tog) 12 times (12)
Rnd 34 (dc2tog) 6 times (6)
Stuff hand, fold top flat and overstitch closed.

Ch12 and sl st to join into a circle **Rnds 1-22** dc (22 rnds) **Rnd 23** (dc5, dc2 into next st) twice (14) **Rnd 24** dc **Rnd 25** (dc6, dc2 into next st) twice (16) **Rnd 26** dc **Rnd 27** (dc7, dc2 into next st) twice (18) **Rnd 28** dc **Rnd 29** (dc8, dc2 into next st) twice (20) Rnd 30 dc Rnd 31 (dc9, dc2 into next st) twice (22) Rnd 32 dc Rnd 33 (dc10, dc2 into next st) twice (24) Rnd 34 dc Rnd 35 (dc2tog) 12 times (12) Rnd 36 (dc2tog) 6 times (6) Stuff foot, fold top flat and overstitch closed.

- YARN IN APPROPRIATE COLOURS AND THICKNESSES (SEE SIZING FOR A GUIDE)
- A HOOK TO MATCH THE SIZE OF THE YARN BEING USED (SEE SIZING FOR A GUIDE)
- TOY STUFFING
- A SCRAP OF CREAM AND BLACK YARN TO EMBROIDER THE EYES
- A WOOL NEEDLE FOR SEWING UP
- SCISSORS

TOFT YARNS

I have had the pleasure of selecting, designing and manufacturing luxury yarns for the past ten years and Edward's Imaginarium has been crocheted entirely in TOFT yarn. TOFT yarns are luxury, quality, natural fibres manufactured to my distinctive specifications here in the UK. When crocheted in TOFT yarns the projects are supple and soft but with a closed fabric to hide the stuffing inside. Using top-quality natural fibres not only ensures a beautiful finish, but guarantees that these characters will get better and better with every hug.

STUFFING

I have always chosen to stuff my crochet with a synthetic high-loft polyester toy stuffing despite their 100% natural luxury outer. Rather than a contradiction, early experiments with natural wool stuffing taught me



that over time this can become compacted and lumpy which leads to misshapen toys.

WASHING

Using a high-loft polyester toy stuffing ensures that your projects are fully washable on a cold cycle in your machine. Using any type of additional stuffing such as sand, pellets or beans will make the toys un-washable and they would need to be surface sponge cleaned instead.



Your monster will only be as child-safe as you make it, so don't skimp on the stitches when sewing up. I overstitch all the way around the edges of any part I am attaching and give it a good tug to ensure it's never coming back off. I also only use yarn to embroider the eyes. If using safety eyes, buttons or beads please be aware that these should not be used on

a toy for a child under three years of age. I have used cream and black yarn to embroider eyes onto all of my monsters. The lustrous over-dyed black yarn in the TOFT spectrum is perfect for adding the eyes.
