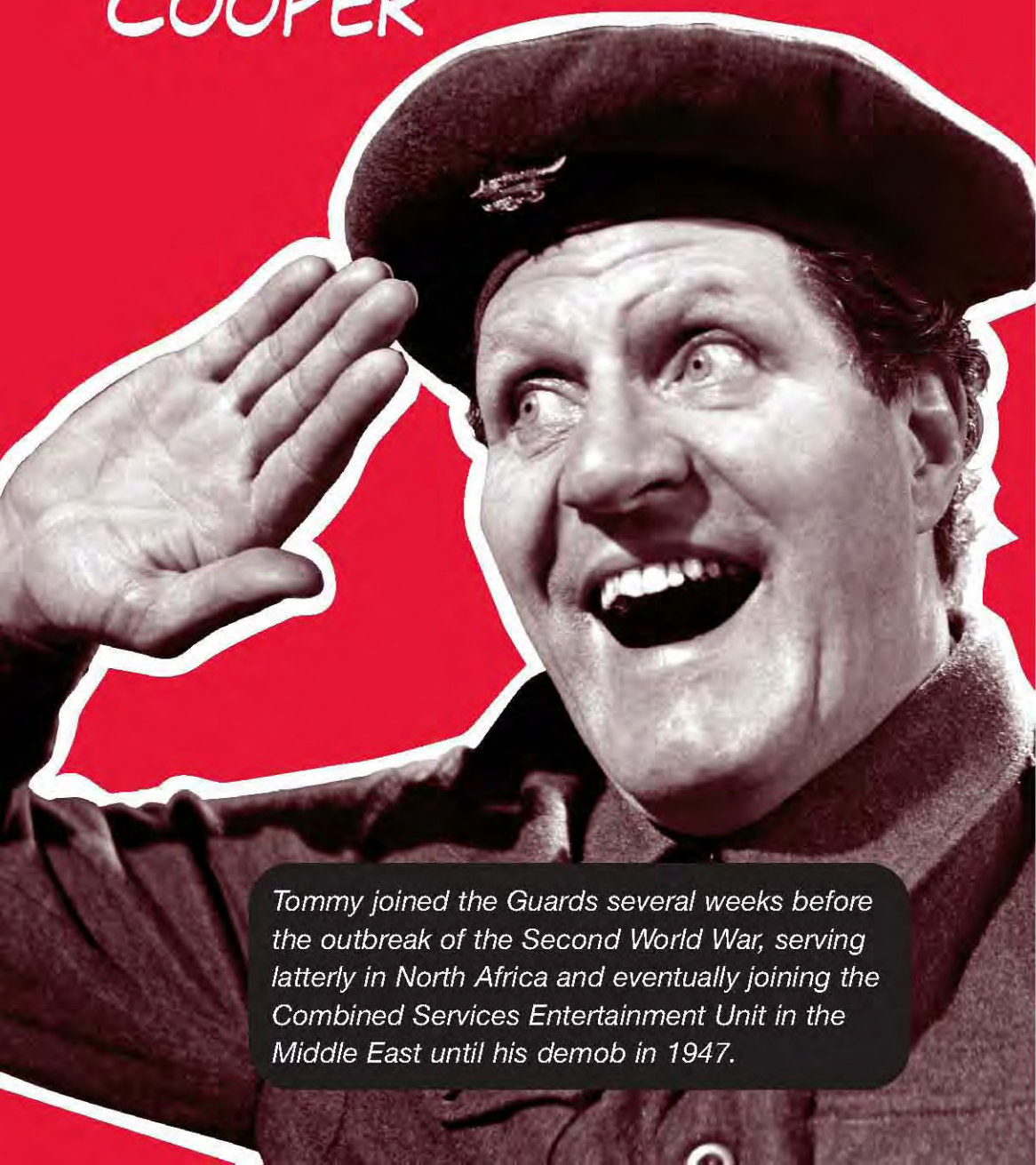

Tommy joined the Guards several weeks before the outbreak of the Second World War, serving latterly in North Africa and eventually joining the Combined Services Entertainment Unit in the Middle East until his demob in 1947.
