In other words, whilst you slumber, the nation still keeps going. Thus, who, in effect, is running the country?

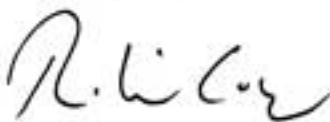
In short, no one is. No one at all!!!

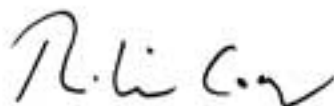
I trust this will be of use.

Pictorial Representation of the 'Two Prime Ministers' Plan

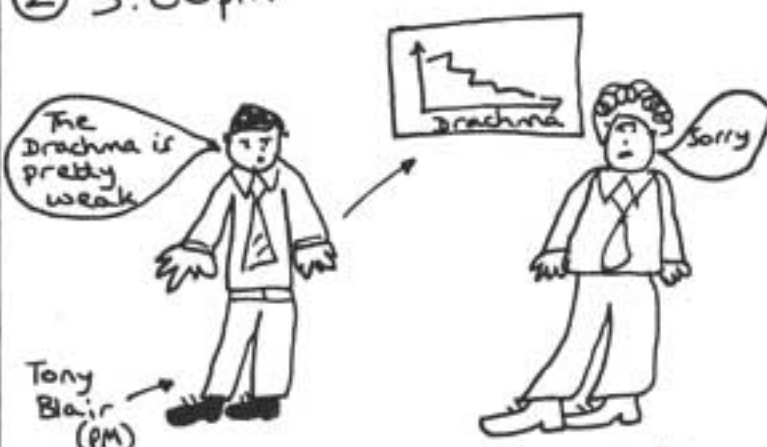

① 12:00pm
Tony Blair is Prime Minister (PM)



Early lunch with Industrialists and tennis players, at no. 10 (Downing Street)

② 3:00pm



Meeting with Greek Ambassador to discuss Drachma, and latest livestock figures.

③ 4:30pm



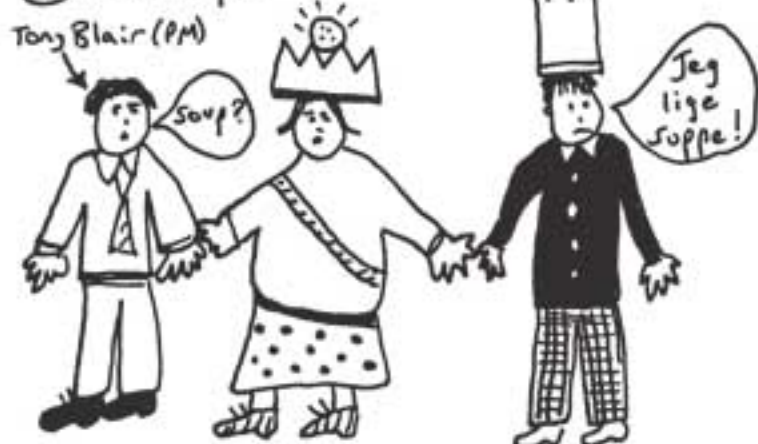
Afternoon tea (alone).

④ 6:00pm



Phone call to South African President (time difference is roughly the same, and there are some cheap rates around at the moment)

⑤ 8:00pm



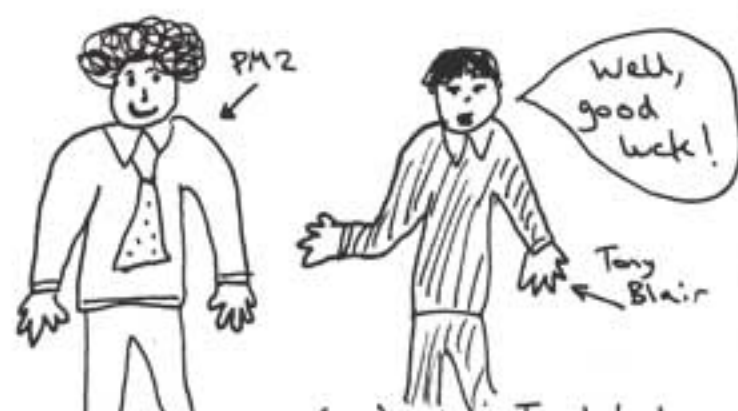
Dinner with Queen and King of Denmark.

⑥ 11:00pm



Prayers and preparation for bed (or 'cot beddie' as Tony Blair calls it).

⑦ Midnight (12:00am)



Prime Minister 2 (PM2) enters Tony's bedroom. They formally shake hands. PM2 is now PM.

⑧ 3:00am



PM2 makes phone call to US President (due to time difference). Tony Blair is asleep at this time (in his 'cot beddie').

⑨ 6:00am



PM2 holds talks with postmen, milkmen and early risers. Tony Blair is still asleep (in his 'cot beddie')

⑩ 9:00am
